

JOINS THE RUSSIAN CHURCH.

Reginald Wright Kauffman is
Named "Basil" at Confirmation.

Reginald Wright Kauffman, author and newspaper man, was on last Saturday morning confirmed in the Russian Orthodox Church. The confirmation or crismation service took place in the Holy Russian Orthodox Cathedral of St. Nicholas, Ninety-seventh Street, just east of Fifth Avenue. The rite was administered by the Most Rev. Alexander, Archbishop of North America and the Aleutian Islands. Mr. Kauffman, who was confirmed alone, took the Church name of "Basil."

The home of Mr. Kauffman is at Columbia, Pa., but he spends much time in England. Some of his books are "The Book of Love," "The Book of Friendship," "The Book of Gratitude," "The Book of Good Cheer," "The Bachelor's Guide to Matrimony," "The House of Bondage," "The Sentence of Peace," "The Sentence of Silence," "The Latter Day Saints." He has also written many motion picture scenarios.
